# 04/07/2024 Tidewater Orchid Society (TOS) Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President, Sandra Cross at 2:01 pm. Sandra welcomed everyone back to Norfolk Botanical Gardens (NBG). Sandra also welcomed the new members and reported that Peter Breed had donated some plants so that we could have a special raffle just for the newest members.

**Business:** 

• March Show and Sale: Sandra thanked everyone for their efforts to make the show and sale a success. Dori Iwanowski extended a thank you to all who helped as well. In addition, Dori offered special thank yous to the following: Brandt Moran, Frank Drew and Peter for coordinating and getting the display together; Paul Chung, Barbara MacKenchie and Tracey Firgau for being there throughout the show; Karen Jones, Sonia Singh and Ailin Harpole for posting information about the show in the neighborhood newsletter, Facebook, and Instagram, respectively; Dave and Joanne Bryant for the behind-the-scenes help with whatever was needed; Nancy Perkins and Pat Coderre for hospitality; and Patsy Temple for her behind-the-scenes work signing up and organizing volunteers.

• February Meeting Minutes: Jamie Krochmal moved to approve the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Brandt and passed unanimously.

• Hospitality: Sandra reminded the members that they can bring in food for hospitality during the meetings. There are no longer any COVID restrictions in place. She did remind everyone that they need to follow NBG's rules regarding the use of plastics and single use items.

• Chair Change: Louise Roesser is moving to Savannah and will no longer be able to be the American Orchid Society (AOS) representative. Jamie has volunteered to take over the position. Jamie reminded everyone that AOS has a monthly Greenhouse Chat that is available to both members and non-members. Louise informed everyone that on April 17th there is a presentation on viruses. That presentation is only open to members.

• Nominating Committee: The term for current officers ends in June. The nominating committee presented a slate of nominees for consideration. A vote for new officers will take place at the May meeting.

• Richmond Orchid Society (ROS) Show: Brandt presented Sandra with TOS's third place ribbon for the show and \$100 check. He also passed on a note from ROS thanking us for participating in the show.

• Budget Committee: The budget committee has met and the recommended budget has gone through the board. The budget will be presented to the members for a vote. Prior to the vote, however, Sandra addressed several issues and presented three challenges: (1) We have had a negative budget for quite a few years and Sandra would like it to be a priority to balance the budget. Part of this would be to look at how to create growth within the society. This could be done through an existing committee or a 'Growth Committee' could be created. Doña Storey reported that she had already put some thought into this committee and had some ideas. She indicated that PR and promotion will turn into growth for the society. Doña asked that anyone who wanted to volunteer to be part of the committee and to discuss her ideas should send her an email within the next ten days expressing their interest. After the committee meets they will take their ideas and suggestions to the board. (2) There is currently a committee chaired by Dave looking at changes to the bylaws. Some of the changes that will be suggested may help to balance the budget. Sandra asked for all members to have an open mind when the bylaws changes are presented. (3) Sandra challenged TOS to gradually increase the number of shows that we participate in over the next several years. The goal would be to be ready to host a large AOS sanctioned show by the time the renovations are complete at NBG. Sandra noted that NBG was voted the third best botanical garden in the U.S. and that we as an organization should rise to the occasion! Barbara went over the proposed budget. The budget was discussed and Barbara answered members' questions regarding the information. Jamie moved that the budget be approved as written. The motion was seconded by Gerry Chrabot and approved with one member opposing.


• Beginners Class: The Beginners class for this month is on April 20th at Frank Drew's greenhouse.
