Tidewater Orchid Society (TOS) 11/05/2023 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was opened by President Sandra Cross at 2:00 pm at the VT AREC. Patsy Temple introduced Kathy Ward, a slightly new member.

A motion was made by Jamie Krochmal to approve the minutes of the previous meeting and was seconded by Gill Gillespie. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Brandt Moran shared that he spoke with Darrin Duling. Darrin informed him that the Kaplan Conservatory is building a temporary greenhouse at AREC to house orchids while the new site is being constructed at ODU. Darren is hoping to open the greenhouse to small group tours and classes. In addition, he reported that some plants from the Kaplan collection had been donated to both the Botanical Gardens and Norfolk Zoo.

Bert Bennett sent word that the Richmond Orchid Society will host a show and sale in February.

Frank Drew is in charge of the set-up of the exhibit for our show and sale in March and will ask for volunteers to help with that within the next few months.

American Orchid Society (AOS)-Louise Roesser reported that AOS now has at least 250 webinars. Some are free to everyone and some just to AOS members. When you go to the website (aos.org) they are marked accordingly. Penn State and AOS have also partnered to create a series of six classes entitled "Orchids for Everyone" that starts this month. You must register for each class individually. They are free for members and are \$10 each for non-members. The classes will also be recorded and will be available later on the AOS website. The December meeting will be at the AREC and will be a potluck and awards banquet. The meeting will probably start at 1:00. A notice will be sent out in the newsletter to confirm the time.

Treasurer's report -Barbara MacKechnie reported that the society made \$1,423.50 from the auction last month. Barbara also reported that she filed the annual report for the State Commission Statement and paid the \$25 fee.

Secretary's report- nothing to report.

Brandt said that the shipment of virus test strips from Taiwan had come in and to talk to him if you ordered some.

Jamie confirmed that the December meeting/awards banquet would be similar to what has been done in the past.

Dori Iwanowski reported that she is working on getting a speaker for the January meeting and that Tim Coulterson from California will be our speaker for the March show and sale.

Dori introduced Jean Stefanik who was our speaker for the meeting. Jean spoke on two topics today. The first was on Orchids Native to New Zealand. She also included photos of the New Zealand Orchid Society show. After a brief break for refreshments and to visit the sales table, Jean spoke about AOS judges and what it takes to become one. Jean answered the members' specific questions about becoming an AOS judge.

Sandra reported that there is a line item in the budget to help a member if they are interested in becoming a judge. Update***Confirmed 11/26/2023 that this budget line item is currently not funded.

Jean said that she will make a list of websites that she referenced in her presentations and send it to Dori so that it can be put in the newsletter.

Door prizes were then drawn with 13 lucky winners.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:35 pm.

A TOS Beginners' Class was held at Brandt Moran's house near Cape Charles, VA (Virginia Eastern shore) on 11 November, 2023.

The topic for the class was orchid bugs and viruses and how to eliminate, treat, and test for them.

Brandt still has a few plants outside and all are doing well.





Brandt recommended Hi-Yield Slug & Snail Bait, Safer Insect Killing Soap, and Natria Neem Oil.





Safari Granules are an effective insecticide; however the protective precautions required far outweigh the benefits of use by most average orchidists. One must wear tyvek personal protective equipment, respirators, gloves. After use, immediately clean the removed gear and take a shower before any other activity! Extreme caution is required when using this product.

When handling diseased or suspected diseased plants, WEAR disposable gloves for handling EACH plant. This plant has scale.



Trisodium phosphate (TSP) crystals are used for disinfecting tools, use it REGULARLY.



When virus testing an orchid suspected to have a virus, follow package instructions and use great caution so as NOT to spread the virus.
