

08/25/2024 Tidewater Orchid Society (TOS) Meeting Minutes

The TOS meeting at Norfolk Botanical Gardens (NBG) was called to order by president Dori Iwanowski at 2:08 PM. Dori welcomed everyone to the meeting. She asked for new visitors to stand and introduce themselves.

Business

Updates to constitution and bylaws. Dori reported that the board met and approved the updates to the constitution and bylaws. Dave Bryan prepared a Powerpoint presentation with the specific changes to the constitution and bylaws for the members. After the presentation Dori asked the members if they had questions or other proposed changes to the documents. There were none. Jamie Krochmal made a motion to approve the changes as written. The motion was seconded by Don Greaser and passed unanimously.

Beginners' classes. Dave indicated the classes will generally meet the first Saturday of the month AFTER the TOS meeting at Frank Drew's greenhouse. In September the meeting will be held on the 7th and begins at 10:00. Dave indicated that he probably will not have a meeting in December. Dave also stated that he is having some difficulty coming up with topics for the meetings and will discuss with the beginner's group what they would like. At the last meeting members asked for follow-up regarding the various speakers' presentations. Dave will work on providing that follow-up and responding to members' questions.

Kaplan Conservatory. Dori clarified that we, as a society, are closely tied to Old Dominion University and the Kaplan Conservatory. Darrin Duling had reported to the society that construction on the new greenhouse to be housed at the Virginia Tech Agricultural Research Extension Center is underway. He hopes that it will be completed by September 27th.

Committees. Dori introduced the committee chairs and noted that all of the committees will be needing members' assistance this year.

-American Orchid Society (AOS). Chair-Jamie Krochmal. Jamie reported that AOS has a monthly greenhouse chat that is free and open to everyone. The chat typically provides valuable information. The next chat is on September 5th and you can get dates for the other month's chats from the AOS website. AOS also has member's only lectures and Jamie encouraged everyone to join.

-Shows and Auctions. Chairs-Frank Drew, Jamie Krochmal, & Brandt Moran. Brandt reported that the first auction for this year will be the member's auction the first Sunday in October.100% of the proceeds will go to TOS. There is no limit to the number of plants that members can bring in for the auction. In terms of shows, Brandt indicated that shows can be difficult because there are a lot of beginners in the society and it takes a lot of hands to put a show together. The experienced members will try to share their knowledge and expertise about shows with others over time. We may be ready in the spring to enter other shows but we will not host a show at NBG until the new building is ready due to space constraints.

-Table Judging. Chair-Don Greaser. Don developed a hand-out with procedures and guidelines for table judging. At this point he has already chosen several members and alternates for judging and is not looking for additional help at this time. The hand-outs can be picked-up from the back table.

-Historian/Library. Chairs-Don Greaser/Kathy Greaser. Don is our historian if you have historical information that you would like to share. Kathy is the librarian. There is a list of books that TOS has to share on the website. If you would like to check-out a book contact Kathy.

The speaker for the meeting was Peter Breed. Peter shared cultural information with the members. In addition, Brandt spoke briefly about specific plants that Peter recently got from Brazil.

Show table-Brandt and Dylan Whittkower talked about some plants that they brought in for the show table.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:12 pm.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

JOHN ZUKOSKY

I had the privilege of sitting down with TOS royalty over the summer. John was gracious and prepared to answer questions about himself and his orchid background. I was surprised to learn he was

Interested in rocks like I am. He is a commercial grower and like many of us, tries new things to assist in the successful growing of orchids. He first became involved with orchids while growing them in Colorado and helping the Denver Botanical Gardens raise money for an orchid greenhouse. His move to Panama was job related and his love for orchids grew with having them there. He then moved to Virginia, sowed seeds from Brazil in his kitchen to grow more orchids. With his success,

he sold excess plants to cover more orchid buying!

In time another move brought him and his family to Germany and he mailed 400 orchids to himself in Germany as well! Orchids are popular in Europe and in Heidelberg, he could see orchids in people's windows. I asked him what his favorite orchid was and he said that it was the Ghost Orchid. I noticed that he grows a lot of oncidiums and cattleyas in his greenhouse. He told me that the most popular orchid he sells is the mini cattleya. due to their not taking up a lot of room. That is important for any windowsill grower.

When he came back to the US, he decided to settle back in Virginia and as an architect, he designed and built his home with his greenhouse attached. It has passive solar, a concrete floor with a greenhouse roof of polycarbonate with peel and seal. He wisely orientated the property for light and is using screening, and even Spanish moss for shading.

John stresses the importance of not spreading viruses and is very careful in orchid maintenance. He uses a single blade when cutting only one time and then once a lot of blades are accumulated, sterilizing them in the oven @ 350 degrees for 45 minutes. He also feeds the foliage once a month, along with a timed release fertilizer.

TOS Orchid Table Judging Alliance Change proposal:

The TOS Table Judging conducts judging in the following nine orchid alliance categories:

- 1. Cattleya Alliance, species and hybrids
- 2. Cypripedium Alliance, species and hybrids
- 3. Vanda Sub-Alliance, species and hybrids
- 4. Phalaenopsis Sub-Alliance, species and hybrids
- 5. Oncidium Alliance, species and hybrids
- 6. Cymbidium Alliance, species and hybrids
- 7. Dendrobium Alliance, species and hybrids
- 8. Hybrids, other than above
- 9. Species, other than above

Are these categories adequate? Our meeting venues preclude simply adding judging categories. If a new category were to be added, an existing category would have to be deleted. Note then, orchids that would otherwise be displayed in a category that would be deleted, WILL now be judged with other orchids being judged in Hybrids (Category 8) or Species (Category 9).

So, I repeat the question, are these category designations adequate?

If there are changes to be made, the Table Judging Chairman will take your votes. Remember, however to add a category, an existing category must be designated for deletion.

Voting will occur over the remainder of the year. Any new category changes will take effect for the 2025 Judging Year.
